Talk about their feelings.

Play with one or more other children extending elaborating play ideas.

Finds solutions to conflicts.
Becomes more outgoing with unfamiliar people in the safe context of their setting.

Communication and Language

Further extend vocabulary.

Understand a question or instruction that has 2 parts.

Understand why questions.

Child uses future and past tense.

Continue to enjoy songs, stories and rhymes.

Physical Development

Increasingly be able to use and remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to rhythm and music.

Match their developing physical skills to tasks and activities in the setting.

Use one handed tools and equipment.

Use a comfortable grip with good control. Show a preference for a dominant hand. Becoming increasingly independent in meeting their own needs.

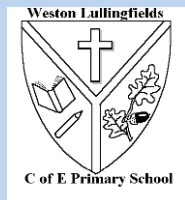
Literacy

Understand print has meaning.

Print can have different purposes.

We read the text from left to right, top to bottom. Can name different parts of a book. Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing. Write some or all of their name. Write some letters accurately.

Mathematics

Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total.

Match numeral to amount up to 5.

Solve real world mathematical problems with numbers up to 5.

Talk about 2D and 3D shapes. Understand positional language.

Discuss routes and locations. Combine shapes to make new ones.

Notice and correct an error in a repeating pattern. Begin to describe a sequence of events.

Expressive Arts and Design

Make imaginative and complex small world. Join different materials and explore different textures. Create closed shapes with continuous lines and begin to use these shapes to represent objects. Draw with increasing complexity and detail. Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings. Respond to what they have heard expressing their thoughts and feelings. Sing more complex songs. Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas.

Understanding the World

Talk about what they see using a wide vocabulary.

Begin to make sense of their own life story and family history.

Plant seeds and care for growing plants.

Understand key features of the life cycle of a plant and an animal.

Talk about the differences between materials and changes they notice.

Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people.
